NSW State Championships, Masters and Roll Offs

Tenpin Bowling Australia's Rules and Regulations will govern this Tournament.

COVID-19 – Statement and Impact

Given the ever changing and currently evolving landscape with COVID-19 and the corona virus it is crucial that all participants, volunteers, administrators, carers, and those either participating or associated with the state championships across the four weekends are adhering to best practice COVID-19 procedures and guidelines.

The event venue/facility will be adequately equipped with COVID-19 best practice protocols including hygiene COVID Safety Marshalls and stations for hygienic purposes, electronic QR code check in points, hand sanitiser stations, temperature checkpoints, and allocated spacing to ensure we comply with NSW state and federal government 1.5m square metre rule policies.

TBANSW requests that all athletes and their support person/s always carry a face mask for preparedness if the state government rules on COVID-19 restrictions change. TBANSW will always adhere with the state government and NSW Health directives. When face masks are imposed to be worn this will be enforced and those who do not wear face masks will not be permitted to bowl or enter Tenpin City. Bowler's entry for that specific event will be deemed forfeited. Exceptions will be honoured following submission of a medical certificate explaining support for inability to wear a face mask.

TBANSW expect bowlers' adherence to all relevant TBA and TBANSW rules and regulations including policies and procedures with emphasis on below rules.

RULE 602 BALL SURFACES ALTERATIONS

1. Unless rule 602(2) applies, altering the surface of a bowling ball by the application of any substance, liquid or abrasive, including Abralon or any other abrasive pads or the use of a recognised ball cleaning or polishing machine or ball spinner during a series or session of continuous games is prohibited. Refer to Rule 128 for the definition of a session of games. A ball may be wiped with a clean cloth or towel at any time. Penalties apply – Refer Offence No. 511.
2. In the event any foreign substance like grease, oil, rubber or similar from the machinery or equipment in the Centre is discovered on the surface of a ball in play it may be removed with an approved ball cleaner by the Tournament Director, League Management, Centre staff or a person or persons authorised by them.
3. Use of Abralon Pads
The surfacing of bowling balls using Abralon pads or any other product in the player's area at any time is prohibited. This rule is not limited to during competition. If a competition offers a ball surfacing table for this purpose it must be used.
4. All balls in a player's possession will be deemed to be used during a series or session of continuous games.

This section of the above rules regarding the application of any substance during competition has been waived until 31st March. TBA will permit the use of isopropyl alcohol at any time during competition to clean a ball – no other approved cleaners will be allowed during competition

All balance holes were eliminated and deemed illegal for use from the 1st of August 2020.

RULE 603 BALL DRILLING SPECIFICATIONS

Holes

The following limitations will govern the drilling of holes in the ball:

1. Holes or indentations for gripping purposes shall not exceed five and shall be limited to one for each finger and one for the thumb, all for the same hand, providing all gripping holes drilled are used to make every delivery with that ball.
2. No more than one (1) vent hole to each finger and/or thumb hole not to exceed ¼ inch in diameter.
3. One mill hole for inspection purposes not to exceed 5/8 inch in diameter and 1/8 inch in depth.
4. **All balance holes were eliminated and deemed illegal for use from the 1st of August 2020.**

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. TBA Tournament Rules and Regulations will apply and all participants must be registered members of TBA in the year of the competition.
TBA Accreditation Number – **A21/084**
2. **Scratch Event:** with three (3) divisions – Disabilities, Junior and Adult. All bowlers will be placed in Grades based on their entering averages.
3. **Disability Bowler:** must meet the requirements of a bowler with a disability under TBA Rule 214 (Definition of Disability).
4. **Junior Bowler:** must not have reached eighteen (18) years as at 1st of January 2021.
A Youth Bowler must not have reached the age of 21 as of the 1st of January 2021.
5. **Adult Bowler:** must have reached eighteen (18) years as at 1st of January 2021.
A Senior Bowler must attain the age of 50 or above in the year of competition.
6. **Championship Events:** will consist of singles, doubles and trios in which each entrant will bowl three (3) games per event. The combination of entries must be all junior, all adults or all disability.
A male and a female can bowl mixed in each category or discipline.
7. **Closing Date:** entries will be accepted up until thirty (30) minutes before the start of any squad, subject to lane availability.
8. **Entry Fees:** All monies owed must be paid to TBANSW with any entry to secure spots including the total amount for doubles and trios squad.
9. **COSTS**
Squads: \$32.00 per bowler for each Trio, Double and Single entry
Masters Qualifying: best series for singles or doubles, \$10 per attempt per Cup or Master a bowler wishes to qualify in, must be paid by check-in at the qualifying squad.
All-Events: \$5.00 per bowler, highest attempt in trios, doubles and singles, including mixed events, will become your All-Events score. This fee must be paid prior to bowling their first event.
10. **Multiple entries:** participants can enter events as many times as they wish to, excluding All-Events. In the case of Disability, multiple entries any extra doubles or trios require at least one new bowler per line-up.
11. Refunds of any sort will not be issued. It is the bowler's responsibility to sell and collect the money for any squad they have nominated or paid for in advance.
12. **Entering Averages** will be taken from a bowler's highest 2020 League or Regular Tournament average, established over eighteen (18) games in a Registered Centre, as of 30th November 2020.



In 2020 many bowlers may have come back to their bowling at different times. Some may have finished in March, some much closer to 30th November, while others later again. Whatever date you were bowling closest to but not past November 30th, (over 18 games) this will be the point at which you establish your highest league or tournament average.

13. Ball delivery used to acquire the entering average must be the exact method the bowler shall use during the championships. *For example, if your entering average was acquired using right-hand delivery then you must use this exact ball delivery when competing in this championships.*
14. Averages will be checked and providing a false average could lead to an automatic disqualification and other penalties. TBANSW reserves the right to re-rate, re-handicap or re-classify a bowler at any time. TBA Offence 501 (Attempting to Gain Unfair Advantage) applies.
15. **No Average:** entries without an established average will apply to the Tournament committee for Classification, if no application then the entering average will be deemed as an Open Grade average.
16. **Replacements:** any change to the original entry must be reported to the Tournament Office thirty (30) minutes prior to the scheduled squad time.
17. **Check-In:** participants must check-in thirty (30) minutes prior to the scheduled time of the event.
18. **Coaching:** will be permitted behind the playing area by TBA Accredited Coaches after presentation of accreditation to the Tournament Director. Coaching will only be permitted if not holding up the play.
19. **Prizes:** trophies/medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd & 3rd place for each grade in all Junior and Disability events.
20. All monies prescribed as "Prize Fund" in Adult Events will be paid out based on one prize for every 10 entries, to a maximum of 3rd place.

21. Bank details must be supplied to be paid any Prize Money.
22. **Smoking and alcohol** consumption are strictly prohibited during play. Juniors are prohibited from smoking or consuming alcohol at any time during the NSW State Championships.
23. **Dress Code:** suitable dress will be determined by the Tournament Director.
Male: collared shirt, long pants or dress shorts. Must wear long pants during the Masters – junior, youth, adult and senior.
Female: collared shirt, dress shorts, skirts or skorts. Tights/leggings when worn with shorts, skirts or skorts is allowed.
No singlets, track pants, jeans, cargo pants, tank tops or hats will be accepted.
24. **Tournament Committee:** reserves the right to make decisions regarding any matter not covered in these rules. The Tournament Director reserves the right to refuse entry to any bowler if required.
25. **Protests:** must be made within thirty (30) minutes of the alleged offence.
26. Acceptance of Rules of this Tournament and the TBA playing Rules is assumed with entry. No claim of ignorance will be accepted.

TBA RULE 214 – DEFINITION OF DISABILITY

A bowler with a disability is defined as a person who suffers from a condition that has limitation, restriction or impairment that restricts everyday activity. The condition is permanent. It should be noted that degree or degrees of pain are not considered a disability.

To prove a disability, a participant needs to provide one of the following types of evidence:

- Valid Disability Support Pension Card (DSP)
- Recipient of the Child Disability Allowance
- Classification Card issued by Tenpin Bowling Australia, Deaf Sports Australia, Blind Sports Australia, Wheelchair Sports Australia or AUSRAPID (or state affiliated organisation)
- Letter from a medical or educational professional:
 - Physiotherapist or Occupational Therapist
 - Principal of Primary, Secondary or Tertiary Education Organisation
 - Psychologist
 - General Medical Practitioner
 - Audiologist
 - Ophthalmologist
- Visual evidence in the case of short statured or participants that are amputees. An amputation is required at the site of major joint. For example, the loss of a foot or both feet, an arm or both arms.

- **MASTERS: all are mixed division**
- **Restricted** – handicap based on 100% of 200, male and female with average 119 and below.
- **Classic** – handicap based on 100% for 200, male and female with average 120 to 159.
- **Open** – scratch event, male and female with average 160 and above.
- **QUALIFYING:** Each qualifying attempt is \$10.00 and must be paid prior to the squad a bowler wishes to use for their qualifying score (singles or doubles). Bowlers may attempt to qualify more than once but must pay the additional fee. Qualifying ends after the 3:30pm squad on Saturday, 6th of February. Top 6 bowlers in each division based on their 3 game score + handicap if applicable will proceed to the final.
- **COST:** \$40 per bowler.
- **FORMAT:** Top 6 bowlers from each Masters division will bowl 6 games. Total pinfall plus handicap will determine the winner for Restricted and Classic. Total pinfall for Open.
- **TIES:** If a tie for the final qualifying position occurs then the highest last game from the qualifying attempt will determine the final placing + handicap if applicable. If a tie still exists a tenth frame roll-off will be conducted until a winner emerges + handicap if applicable.
- **PRESENTATION:** Will follow the Masters. **Winner of each Masters Division** will receive a paid spot to represent NSW at the 2021 National Disability Masters, Trophy and \$50.00. Runner-up will receive \$50.00.

TBANSW STATE MASTERS

The two (2) tables (below) list the Masters and Cups being competed throughout the State Championships. Please note the individual eligibility and information for each event.

For all Masters events:

- Participants must complete an All-Events entry in the 2021 NSW State Championships prior to the Masters or Cup they wish to compete in.
- All events have two (2) divisions – female and male, with Disability combined DIVISIONS.
- Qualifying can take place in single and doubles squads of the 2021 NSW State Championships.
- Each qualifying attempt is \$10.00 and must be paid prior to the squad a bowler wishes to use for their qualifying score.
- Bowlers may attempt to qualify more than once but must pay the applicable fee for each event.
- Bowler's handicap will be added to their scratch qualifying score to determine their qualifying position for Adult and Junior Restricted Masters.
- Handicaps are based on 100% of 200 allocated from entering averages.
- If a tie for the final qualifying position occurs, then the highest last game from the qualifying attempt will determine the final placing. If a tie still exists a tenth frame roll-off will be conducted until a winner emerges.
- If a tie for the final qualifying position in any cut during the finals occurs, then a tenth frame roll-off will be conducted until a winner emerges.
- All finalists will be allowed practice on each of their starting two (2) lanes only.
- Any bowler not checked in by the advertised time will be disqualified and the next available qualifier will replace this position.

All Other Divisions – Entries Close FRIDAY 12th February 2021

Eligibility Criteria

1. **DISABILITY** – Must meet the requirements of a bowler with a disability under TBA Rule 214.
2. **2021 NSW PRESIDENT'S SHIELD** - Participants shall not have reached 18 years of age on the 1st January in the year of competition (2021).
Must hold a current TBA Registration and hold a current Silver Membership prior to departing for the 2021 Tenpin Bowling Australia Australian National Championships in Hobart. TBA Registration must be confirmed at check-in.
3. **TBA21** – Participants shall not have reached 21 years of age on the 1st January in the year of competition (2021).
Must hold a current TBA Registration and hold a current Silver Membership prior to departing for the 2021 Tenpin Bowling Australia Australian National Championships in Hobart. TBA Registration must be confirmed at check-in.
4. **RACHUIG** – Participants must have attained the age of 18 years on or prior to the first day of competition of the 2021 National Championships.
Must hold a current TBA **ADULT** Registration and hold a current Silver Membership prior to departing for the 2021 Tenpin Bowling Australia Australian National Championships in Hobart. TBA Registration must be confirmed at check-in.
5. **TBA50** – Participants must have attained the age of 50 years in the year of the competition (2021).
Must hold a current TBA Registration and hold a current Silver Membership prior to departing for the 2021 Tenpin Bowling Australia Australian National Championships in Hobart. TBA Registration must be confirmed at check-in.
6. Must be a current financial TBA Registered Bowler and with good financial standing with the TBANSW.
7. Must be capable of conducting themselves in such a manner so as not to reflect discredit on TBA, TBANSW or Tenpin Bowling.
8. Must have bowled a minimum of 24 games in a League or accredited tournament (where an average is kept for future use) in a TBA Registered centre in NSW during the current year. League games completed as pre-bowling do not count towards the No of games bowled.
9. Must have completed All-Events entry in the 2021 NSW State Championships.
10. Must reside in NSW for a period that enables participation in the Roll Off. Requests for exemption to this rule must be in writing to TBA (refer TBA website for eligibility criteria).
11. Completed the TBANSW Team Roll Off nomination form and submitted prior to the cutoff date.
12. Must have paid the non-refundable nomination fee by 5pm on Friday 5th of February for Disability or on Friday 12th of February for all other divisions. Please note a bowler can nominate for more than one team if they satisfy the eligibility criteria. The remaining roll-off fee, if any, must be paid prior to close of check-in on the first day.
13. Abide by the TBA Code of Ethics.

General Rules

1. All TBA rules and regulations will apply.
2. Any bowler failing to complete any stage of the Roll Off will not be entitled to a refund of any monies paid and will be considered as withdrawing from the event.
3. Dress Code: Suitable dress will be determined by the Tournament Director. Male: collared shirt, long pants or dress shorts. Female: collared shirt, dress shorts, skirts or skorts. Tights/leggings when worn with shorts, skirts or skorts is allowed.
No singlets, track pants, jeans, cargo pants, tank tops or hats will be accepted.
4. Smoking is prohibited for bowlers during a series or session of continuous games. This also includes E cigarettes.

Format

All bowlers shall bowl 12 games in total: 6 games on Saturday 13th February and 6 games on Sunday 14th February. A full roll-off shall be required regardless of the total numbers received for state team nominations. Bowlers will be assigned a starting lane at check-in. Lane change format will be announced on the day. This shall depend on social distancing rules and number of participants.

Team Selection – 2021 NSW Disabilities Cole Cup Team and 2021 NSW Disabilities Open Team

All teams shall be determined by their finishing positions in the All Events. Cole Cup shall be based on total pinfall plus handicap. Open Team shall be based on total scratch pinfall. The first eight (male and female combined) bowlers past the post (who nominated) shall form the NSW State Open Teams for the National Disability Championships. The balance of players (who nominated) shall have their handicaps added to their Allevents scores and the next 8 players will be selected for the Cole Cup team. In the event of a tie in eight position in either team, the highest last game will break the tie.

Team Selection – 2021 NSW President's Shield Team and 2021 NSW TBA21 Team

All teams shall be determined in a roll off of 6 games each day over two days, total 12 games. The first three male and female bowlers past the post on total pinfall shall be team members. The fourth team member is by selection by the NSW Head Coach and team management. This shall determine the NSW State Teams for the 2021 National Championships. In the event of a tie in third position a further one game will be bowled to break the tie. Subsequent ties will be broken with 9th and 10th frame playoffs.

Team Selection – 2021 NSW Rachuig Team

The top five male and female bowlers by total scratch pinfall in a roll of 6 games each day over 2 days shall make the team. If all these bowlers are over 25, the highest placed bowler by total pinfall aged U25 will take the 6th position. Otherwise, the sixth place shall automatically take the remaining spot to complete the team. In the event of a tie in fifth or sixth position a further one game will be bowled to break the tie. Subsequent ties shall be broken with 10th frame playoffs.

Team Selection – 2021 NSW TBA50 Team

The top four male and female bowlers by total scratch pinfall in a roll of 6 games each day over 2 days shall make the team. This shall determine the NSW State Teams for the 2021 National Championships. In the event of a tie in fourth position a further one game will be bowled to break the tie. Subsequent ties will be broken with 10th frame playoffs.

All state teams shall have two reserves in the event of a bowler withdrawing from the team.

Selection Criteria where applicable.

The following criteria shall be used to assess the athletes who are eligible for selection.

- Results in all TBA Accredited Events including NSW State Championships and National Championships.
- Consistency in standards of behaviour, attitude and sportsmanship
- Coachability
- Team Cohesiveness and balance
- Previous experience
- Performance during the roll-off
- Further information can be found in the NSW State Team Selection Policy

Selection Process

1. Those bowlers who finished in 4th positions should be selected unless (as per TBA Selection Process Rule 4.1 (a)):
 - There is ample evidence that another bowler in the selection pool has a better history relating to average, ability, team performance or any other qualifications deemed relevant.
 - The committee must be prepared to supply the unsuccessful person/s in writing with the reason for their non-selection.
2. Selection will be made by the Committee which includes the head coach and team management.

Appeals

An athlete not gaining selection may lodge an appeal. Appeals can only be made in accordance with the Athlete Appeal Procedure as documented in the NSW TBA State Team Selection Policy. An appeal must be addressed in writing to the Selection Panel. This shall be sent to cherrie.tbansw@gmail.com and must be received within 24 hours of the announcement of the team. Beyond this timeframe appeals will be immediately dismissed. The Selection Panel will review appeals in the first instance. Should an appeal be lodged, the status of the announced team or position remains unconfirmed until the appeals process has been completed.

Any further review of appeals and selection outcomes, as outlined in the TBANSW Selection Policy, will be by an independent appeals panel appointed by the TBANSW Advisory Committee including Geoff Bowness, Cherrie Dinham, Jim Bakirtzidis and Denielle Clifton. Should an appellant be dissatisfied with the answer received from the Appeals Panel, they should lodge a further and final appeal with TBA.

Conditions

- Acceptance of the rules and conditions of this event cover a payment plan which will be determined at a later date. Our current landscape is greatly affected by COVID-19 uncertainties. We are hoping to get this out as soon as possible.
